Cantate Domino — Pitoni (1657-1743)

Giuseppe Pitoni was an eminent musician of the Roman School. He was interested in and greatly influenced by Palestrina.

O Sacred Head — Bach (1685-1750)

This beautiful chorale is familiar to all. This particular setting is from the Saint Mathew Passion.

Hear Lord, Our God — Tschaikowsky (1840-1893)

Tschaikowsky wrote a considerable amount of music for the church. This eight part introit is from the Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom.

Agnus Dei — Hassler (1564-1612)

Hassler was born in Nuremberg, but spent a great deal of time in Italy. He is considered one of the founders of German music.

Linden Lea — Vaughan-Williams (1872-)

The pleasant rural sentiment of W. Barnes is aptly set, by the dean of English composers.

In Stilly Night — Brahms (1833-1897)

Sing a Song — Diack

A nursery rhyme set in the way Handel might have done.

Solo: O Isis and Osiris — Mozart (1759-1791)

This famous and beautiful solo is from The Magic Flute.
